Our newest Avenue of Service came about in 2010 when Youth Service was designated to recognize the positive change implemented by youth and young adults through leadership development activities, involvement in community and international service projects and exchange programs that enrich and foster world peace and cultural understanding.

A New Generation Service Exchange (NGSE) program for 18 to 30 year olds was just approved and presented at the RI Convention in Sao

Paulo last week. This program fills the gap between the traditional youth programs and Rotary. This program is a 30 to ~90 day international work internship funded by the traveler and facilitated by District to District MOU's to insure a host residence or family and internship have been arranged. This internship could be for crafts, trades, university study or professional business experience to develop new leaders. This New Generations Service Exchange (NGSE) has not been formally established by our District 5470 at this time but if there are interested Rotarians that would like to arrange international internships for young professionals, please contact Bill Tarpley at 970-247-8867 to discuss the development of this program.
