\*and throwing one grand party the last week of September each year.

To distinguish the organization from its festival, it has a new name: "MOUNTAIN HARVEST CREATIVE"

Throwing a big party is just one thing we do.

The organization is beginning to attract grant funds. Potential grantors were confused.

Then she listed 22 different organizations or events that they support in the process of showcasing the bounty of the North Fork Valley of the Gunnison. The festival, including all of our products and talents, advertises all over the Western Slopes and way beyond, bringing money into to North Fork community.

Bill's report to the town of Paonia shows: Approaching \$400,000 last year \$150,000 directly, conservative multipliers = \$370,000.

The festival attracts a lot of out of town visitors .
